



## Ten Simple Rules

- Don't be afraid your voice is important;
  people will listen
- Never post when angry
- Strive for accuracy
- When in doubt, pause.
- Respect PHI
- Ask permission
- Be respectful
- Another Pho rule: "Never engage criticism."
- Be careful friending patients online
- Educate yourself and ask questions –
  Doctors online are mostly nice.

- Tweets can also include links and images.


